The following is a summary of a recent survey by members of the Range Rover Discovery Club on its approach and variety of club trips

1 How many trips do you participate in annually?

Most doing between 3 and 5 trips annually.

2 What may prevent you from participating in trips?

Most citing work or family commitments with a few citing finance as an issue.

3 How do you rate the trips on offer?

Almost everyone said they liked the range and variety of trips offered.

4 How would you rate the difficulty of trips?

The majority rated them as easy to medium with some bits interesting or challenging, i.e. generally about right.

5 What is you preferred trip length?

A wide variety here from a long weekend, 5 to 10 days and then 2 to 4 weeks.

6 What is your widest travel radius around Adelaide?

People generally said Day Trips up to 2 hours travel, base camp trips up to a day's travel with longer trips from 1000km to no limit.

7 What is your preferred accommodation?

Most stated caravan or camper with a tent option. 5 included a cabin with only 1 citing a cabin only.

8 How much notice period do you need to plan for trips?

Most requested up to 6 months or more for major trips reducing to 2 to 3 months for shorter ones.

9 What is your preferred method of being advised bout trips and club matters?

Almost everyone mentioned the club magazine, calendar and meetings as their preferred method with e-mails a close second.

10 What prevents you from leading or planning trips?

Over half said they would think about it but others preferred to go with the flow. A few were not comfortable, nor interested in leading.

11 What do you like best about the trips on offer?

Most liked the mix and variety of trips, the fellowship and the company of others.

12 What improvements would you like to see?

A good number were happy with current trips but others would like to include more 'free' days, to not

infotainment system. For tech geeks, the system is powered by two Qualcomm Snapdragon 820am Automotive Platforms, each with an integrated Snapdragon X12 modem. At launch, it was announced that 14 individual control modules would be able to receive remote updates. That has increased to 16 with the first production vehicles - which we'll hopefully be getting to see next issue and the aim is to increase it to more than 45 by the end of 2021. We wonder how effective it'll prove in the outback or Welsh hills.

SOTA or Software Over The Air.

I briefly mentioned at the previous meeting that the new Defender would have the ability when near open or public wi-fi to down load software to update the vehicles computer systems. Thanks to Michael Bull for the picture on the left. This technology has been around for a number of years and like all technology has improved greatly. My initial reaction was to think about the system being hacked regardless of how well they claim it would be encrypted. Even though the technology and security has improved I still have reservations.
